YOU MAKE THE CALL

Rule #1 Answers

1. In match play, the player and opponent may agree how to decide a Rules issue so long as they do not deliberately agree to apply the Rules in the wrong way.

True or False?
Answer: True.

Rule References – Rule 1.3c(3) and Rule 20.1b(1).

Note: If the players do not agree, or have doubt about how the Rules apply, either player may request a ruling under Rule 20.1b(2).

2. When a player has breached a Rule and that Rule allows them to play a ball from a different place than where their original ball lies (e.g. deciding to treat their ball as unplayable) the penalty is one stroke.

True or False?

Answer: True.

Rule Reference - Rule 1.3c(2)

Note: The one stroke penalty also applies in both match play and stroke play where the potential advantage from a breach is minor.

3. A principle of the Rules of Golf is that when a single act by a player results in two Rules being beached, only a single penalty applies.

True or False?

Answer: True.

Rule Reference - Rule 1.3c(4).

Note: If the penalties are different it is the higher-value penalty that applies.

4. In stroke play, a Committee can disqualify a player for serious misconduct, even if the competition has closed and the result announced.

True or False?
Answer: True.

Rule Reference – Rule 20.2e(2) and Rule 1.2.

Note: If the Committee finds that the player has committed serious misconduct by acting contrary to the spirit of the game, they may disqualify the player under Rule 1.2.

5. A principle of the Rules of Golf is that if unrelated acts result in one Rule being breached more than once, multiple penalties apply.

True or False?

Answer: True.

Rule Reference – Rule 1.3c(4).

Note: The player gets a separate penalty for each unrelated breach.

6. If a player knows that they have breached a Rule that involves a penalty and deliberately fails to apply the penalty on the scorecard they return, they are disqualified.

True or False?

Answer: True.

Rule Reference – Rule 1.3b(1).

Note: Players are responsible for honestly applying the Rules to themselves.

7. In stroke play, without marking their ball lying in a general area, a player lifts it to make a positive identification, cleans it and then instead of replacing it, drops it close to where it lay. The penalty is limited to two strokes.

True or False?

Answer: True.

Rule Reference – Rule 1.3c(4).

Note: If a player's related acts breach one or more procedural requirements where the penalty is one stroke and then play from a wrong place, the penalty is limited to two strokes.

8. The penalty of disqualification only applies when a player has wrongly gained a potential advantage that is too significant for their score to be considered valid.

True or False?

Answer: False.

Rule Reference - Rule 1.3c(2).

Note: Whilst a player is disqualified in the circumstance of this question they may also be disqualified for breaches involving serious misconduct (see Rule 1.2).

9. In stroke play, players may not decide any doubtful issue they have on the Rules by agreement, but must play on and raise the issue with a referee or the Committee when they become available and in any case before returning their scorecard.

True or False?

Answer: True.

Rule Reference – Rule 1.3b(1).

Note: Players are expected to recognize when they have breached a Rule and to be honest in applying their own penalties. If they are uncertain what to do it is recommended that they play two balls, as per Rule 20.1c(3).

10. In stroke play, a player authorizes his or her caddie to drop a ball (A Violation of Rule 14.3b) in a wrong place.

The player makes a stroke at the ball (A Violation of Rule 14.7a). What is the ruling?

- a) The player gets a penalty of one stroke.
- b) The player gets the general penalty
- c) The player gets a total penalty of three strokes.

Answer - b

Rule Reference – Rule Reference 1.3c(4)

Note#1: While a player may authorize anyone to lift his or her ball (Rule 14.1b); a player may not authorize anyone to drop his or her ball (Rule 14.3b).

Note #2: A player or a player's Partner may drop a player's ball (Rule 22.2 and Rule 23.5a)

- 11. In stroke play, a player makes a stroke at an incorrectly substituted ball from the wrong place. What is the ruling?
 - a) There is no penalty.
 - b) The player gets the general penalty.
 - c) The player gets a penalty of four strokes.

Answer – b

Rule Reference – Rule Reference 1.3c(4)

Note: The penalty for making a stroke at an incorrectly substituted ball or playing from a wrong place is loss of hole in Match Play (Rule 1.3c(2)).
